New Senior Adult Ministry Coordinator

The Atlantic Northeast District is pleased to announce the call of **Nancy** *Fittery* to serve as the new Senior Adult Ministry Coordinator for ANE. She will work with the Senior Adult Committee to plan and promote Senior Adult Banquets, give attention to senior adult needs and interests through the Senior Adult Newsletter, foster awareness of aging and wellness, and promote

and communicate senior adult concerns in the district. She will also serve as a liaison to the District Women's Fellowship.

Nancy brings solid organizational and planning skills, as well as communication skills. She has worked with Lancaster Newspapers, COBYS Family Services, & Lititiz CoB Church Office prior to completing the TRIM Program, being ordained and serving as Pastor of Swatara Hill CoB. Nancy begins her work with the district on Jan. 1, and will continue as pastor at Swatara Hill CoB.

Evangelism Re-Focus

At the November District Board Retreat, the Atlantic Northeast District Board took action to re-position a focus on evangelism within the Commission on Church Development. This simply means that evangelism will now be partnered with church planting, church revitalization, and church growth. Previously, evangelism was connected with the ministries of the Witness Commission.

In making this shift, the Evangelism Committee will now work with the Commission on Church Development while the Witness Commission will be re-named "Commission on Witness and Outreach." The chief focal point here will be peace, social justice, urban ministry, disaster response, support congregations, and service ministries.

It is important to note that all areas of our ministry life should be flavored with an evangelistic spirit. This shift allows for a direct emphasis and commission connection with congregations in growth and development.

Please continue to watch for ministry efforts in these important areas of district ministry and pray that we will be found faithful in each of our life and witness together.

A special note from ANE District Executive, Craig Smith

As your congregation considers 2011 giving, it is vitally important for you to remember that congregational giving is the life-link of financial support for District Ministries. While there are many good things that are happening "out there," please remember that there are scores of wonderful and meaningful ministries taking place right here in our own backyard. I want to highlight just a few of the significant things going on right here in ANE:

Each year congregations count on the District Executive to provide leadership in pastoral and ministerial placement. Bringing strong pastoral leadership to our congregations is vital to ministry success. In the past year, I have worked with 6 congregations in some phase of this process.

The work of the District Ministry Commission is fundamental: 25 new candidates for Licensed Ministry; ministerial training for 46 Licensed Ministers; 6 newly ordained persons; and providing quality administrative oversight for more than 240 Ordained Ministers.

More than \$81,000 is given as "direct" support for urban congregations and Family Life Center outreach. This amount is <u>significantly increased</u> by adding "indirect" gifts: volunteer hours, gifts in kind, personal and congregational designated gifts, Mission Church Support Fund grants, and TURF grants - <u>all</u> these coordinated through District efforts.

\$35,000 is available through district grant and resourcing programs.

Church planting is strong. Veritas and *common cup*, two new church planting initiatives in ANE, continue to grow; Light of the Gospel, in Brooklyn, has achieved Fellowship status and was recognized at this year's Annual Conference in Pittsburgh; Renacer, a Hispanic project in Leola is being nurtured by the Conestoga CoB; the Maine Mission group is working with ANE to launch a new project in Sanford, Maine. This is good news for sharing the Good News!

Strong senior high and junior high youth ministry events, a growing young adult network, networking and discussion groups, NYC, NOAC, work camps, disaster relief efforts, increased levels of coaching, the Urban Initiative Task Team, stewardship education, ministry to senior adults, retreats, continuing educations opportunities, international ministry exchanges, vital training partnerships with: Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center, Bethany Theological Seminary, and a variety of local ministry-training institutions is strong, and . . . much much MORE!

These highlights simply scratch the surface of the district-based ministry links impacting congregations, the Church of the Brethren denomination, communities, and most importantly, the lives of those with whom we work.

PASTOR CELEBRATES SILVER ANNIVERSARY



The Rev. Dr. Wallace B. Landes, Jr., Senior Pastor of the Palmyra CoB celebrated 25 years of service with the congregation this November. Born in Waynesboro, VA, Pastor Landes was licensed into the Christian ministry while a senior in high school. After graduating from Bridgewater College and Bethany Theological Seminary, he was ordained in 1978. The Doctor of Ministry Degree from Princeton Theological Seminary was conferred upon Pastor Landes in May 1998.

Prior to coming to Palmyra, Pastor Landes served as pastor of the Bush Creek CoB in MD for seven years. He has been greatly involved in both the Mid-Atlantic and Atlantic Northeast Districts, serving as a member of numerous committees and

boards. Pastor Landes has been a contributing author and guest editor for *Brethren Life and Thought* as well as a contributor to other Biblical study guides and theological journals and an instructor and conference speaker.

Ecumenical work has been important in Pastor Landes' life, as he has served as President of the Palmyra Area Cooperating Churches, Chair of the planning committee for State Pastors' Conference, member of the governing board and personnel committee for the PA Council of Churches.

In the academic world, Pastor Landes has been an adjunct faculty member of the Religion Department for Lebanon Valley College and also the Department of Religious Studies, Elizabethtown College. He presently serves as a member of the Board of Trustees for Elizabethtown College.

Pastor Landes is married to Bonnie Simmonds Landes, a kindergarten teacher in the Annville-Cleona School District. They have two adult children, Matthew and Kendra.

McPherson College Student Receives Mercedes-Benz Scholarship

Mercedes-Benz USA recently agreed to provide three annual scholarships to McPherson College totaling \$15,000 per year. The college is the premier choice for an education in automotive restoration; it's the only one that offers a four-year degree in the major. Each year, one \$5,000 scholarship will be awarded to each of three students working toward an automotive restoration degree. This year, one of the recipients is *Rod Barlet*, a member of Elizabethtown CoB.

As a child, Barlet used to take apart anything mechanical – starting with his bicycle at age six. Later, he recalled what a treat it was to ride in his grandfather's 1974 Mercedes-Benz 240D. That early exposure has carried through his life and on to McPherson College. There professors encourage individual, in-depth research as opposed to spouting out easy answers.

Barlet said the new internship opportunity would take an automotive restoration student's learning to the next level. "Just like any other profession, your education never really stops," he said.
