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A special thanks to the 43 of our 77 Congregations, Fellowships, and Projects who have financially contributed to District ministries in the first quarter of 2011. Our budgeted expenditure amount for the first guarter was \$158,362.25. The total giving for the same guarter was only \$148,066.31. It is important to remember that congregational giving is the primary financial support for District Ministries. While there are many good things that

are happening "out there." please remember that there are scores of wonderful and meaningful ministries taking place right here among our own Atlantic Northeast District 'family'.

The following narrative describes how the total of our 2011 Ministry Investment Plan is allocated to our District Ministries. This includes our District Executive, Support Staff, and Directors' salaries.

Pastoral/Congregational Ministries

Pastoral and congregational ministries provide assistance for ministerial leadership including Readiness for Ministry, pastoral placement and search committee efforts, ministerial training, continuing education events, consultation services for pastors and lay leadership, financial aid for ministerial study, and fiscal support for Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center.

Stewardship Ministries

Stewardship ministries provide for stewardship promotion, congregational and individual stewardship resources and maintenance costs for District owned properties.

Nurture and Leadership Development Ministries

Nurture and Leadership Development ministries provide for District sponsored Jr. High, Sr. High, and Young Adult ministries, Leadership Development resources, Ministry Forums and Leadership Workshops.

Witness, Outreach, and Evangelism Ministries

Witness, Outreach, and Evangelism ministries provide Peace and Social Justice resources, Evangelism programs and resources, volunteers and funding for Disaster Response, and support for Family Life Centers and Urban ministries in Harrisburg, Lancaster, New York, and Philadelphia.

Church Development and Church Revitalization Ministries

Church Development and Revitalization ministries provide support for planting and developing new congregations and the revitalization of small, struggling congregations. These ministries are also supported by income earned from congregations contributing \$5 per active attendee to the Seeds of Faith Fund.

General Operating and Administrative Ministries

General Operating and Administrative ministries include costs for District insurance, auditors, accountants, treasurer, office building maintenance and utilities, Historical Committee, Spiritual Renewal Team, and dues for Annual Conference and PA Council of Churches.

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PETER BECKER COMMUNITY CELEBRATES 40th ANNIVERSARY

Four-Day Event Honoring Generosity, Service, Trust, & Faith

From its modest opening in 1971, Peter Becker Community has grown over the last 40 years into the outstanding Continuing Care Retirement Community that it is today. An array of activities and events marked the 40th Anniversary celebration, which was held from May 19 to 22.



The celebratory week began with the Benevolent Fund Dinner on Thursday, May 19. This event invited our friends and benefactors to help us along the journey toward meeting this year's goal of raising over \$137,000 for our Benevolent Fund. Thanks the to the generosity of the people involved, we were able to raise \$112,000 toward our goal.

The activities on Friday, May 20 focused on thanking the caring staff at the Community for all of the service they provide to ensure that Peter Becker Community is the best place to live. The events included a 70's dress up contest, a picnic lunch and informal hula hoop and trivia challenges. On Saturday, May 21, several picnics were held to honor the residents, their families, and guests who trust in our ministry. The picnics were followed by a free concert.

On Sunday, May 22, a culminating event was held in the chapel focusing on "Our Journey of Faith." It was an Anniversary Worship Service with many special guests including each of the three CEO's who have led the ministry through the years: Ronn Moyer, CEO from 1971 - 1993, Rod Mason, CEO - 1993 - 2005, and Carol Berster, CEO 2006 - Present. Carol Berster honored the past, looked forward noting the current expansion project, and offered thanks. 

New Orleans, LA

Nearly six years after Hurricane Katrina devastated New Orleans, leveled and cleaned concrete pads are vivid reminders of the before and after. Returning volunteers are encouraged by the changes in seeing families and businesses returning. As Brethren Disaster Ministries ceases their services in the Chalmette, LA area in May, over 2,141 volunteers have been witnesses for Christ through their faith in action. A total of 24,670 work days (197,360 hours worked) enabled 249 households to be served in full or in part. RENOVARÉ ESSENTIALS CONFERENCE

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The Atlantic Northeast District Spiritual Renewal Team is pleased to announce that a one-day Renovaré Essentials Conference will be held at Elizabethtown College on Saturday, April 21, 2012 in Leffler Chapel. Because of limited seating capacity, churches are urged now to begin planning how this conference can help in the spiritual growth of their congregations.

Chris Webb and Richard Foster will be our leaders. Chris, the new president of Renovaré and Anglican pastor from Wales, has such a pastoral heart. Richard Foster, founder of Renovaré and author of *Celebration of Discipline*, is a leader in developing the Christian spiritual life and has a new book *The Sanctuary of the Soul*. We are blessed and humbled to have a strong leadership team.

Another feature will be for children. Using lessons by Jean Moyer on spiritual disciplines like prayer, sessions will be taught along with children's activities. Renovaré has a bookstore of spiritual resources for your church. The day is set to be one of spiritual growth, a balanced vision and a day for personal and corporate spiritual renewal. The 2000 conference was life changing for many.

Rather than a stand-alone event, much of the emphasis of this conference will be on both the preparation prior to the conference and the follow-up after the conference. Before the conference, pastors may preach on the 12 classic spiritual disciplines using Richard Foster's book and companion volume, Spiritual Classics. This kind of emphasis would lend itself nicely to the 2012 Lenten/Easter season and prepare persons to come to the conference April 21.

Following the conference, the committee will provide ideas and resources for churches to build on this experience. Each church is encouraged to develop their own plan for spiritual growth discerning what is meaningful for their congregation. There will be an add-on day sponsored by Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center on "Growing in Spiritual Vitality: Personal and Congregational."

This summer the committee will be send out conference brochures, a video on the conference will be available online, and the date for registration will be announced in the fall.




