NATIONAL SENIOR HIGH YOUTH OPPORTUNITY

Christian Citizenship Seminar (CCS)

What is it? This program provides high school students the chance to explore the relationship between faith and a particular political issue, and then act from a faith perspective regarding that issue.

Who is Eligible to Attend? All high school youth and their adult advisors are eligible to attend the seminar. Churches sending over four youth are required to send at least one adult advisor.

Where and When? We will begin on Saturday, April 14 at 5:00 p.m. in New York City and will end by 12:00 (noon) on Thursday, April 19 in Washington, DC.

What is the cost? The \$375 registration fee includes: lodging for five nights, dinner on the opening evening of the seminar, and transportation from New York to Washington, DC.

Note: Each participant will need to bring additional money for most meals, sightseeing, personal expenses and some subway/taxi fares within the city.

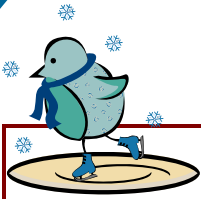
What is Ministry Summer Service?

Elizabethtown Pastor Receives Lily Endowment Grant

The Elizabethtown Church of the Brethren has received a grant of \$47,561 to enable its pastor, Greg Davidson-Laszakovits, to participate in the National Clergy Renewal Program funded by the Indianapolis-based Lilly Endowment Inc. It is one of 158 congregations across the country that will support their ministers in the program, which allows pastors to step back from their busy lives and renew their spirits for the benefit of their ongoing ministries.

“We ask these congregations and ministers to consider the question, ‘What will make your heart sing?’, as they devise their plans,” said Craig Dykstra, senior vice president for religion at the Endowment. “They never fail to come up with wonderful and imaginative yet doable ways to fulfill their dreams. Their time away has freed them up to pursue personal and professional interests and needs in ways that have given them new energy for ministry – and the congregations have discovered that they too experience a refreshment of their own and a newfound sense of their own strengths.”

The Elizabethtown Church of the Brethren has designed a renewal plan around the theme of “Rootedness and Reaching” to “root deeper” by nourishing and deepening personal and congregational rootedness in God so that together they may “reach farther”.

Pastor Laszakovits and his family will spend nine weeks in Brazil where he will engage in reflective activities—daily prayer, reading, journaling—as well as education, recreation, and travel to nourish body, mind, and spirit. These renewing activities will be pursued in Brazil because an immersion into a different culture and language will provide a sharp separation from the routines of congregational life and work.

“Furthermore”, Laszakovits stated, “cross-cultural immersion, studying Portuguese, and observing church life in a radically different context will stretch me beyond my standard frames of reference and nudge me to experience God’s presence in new and creative ways.” Simultaneously, the congregation will engage in activities including two weekend retreats that encourage the members to root deeper in ways that will nourish their individual and corporate spiritual health and reach as well.

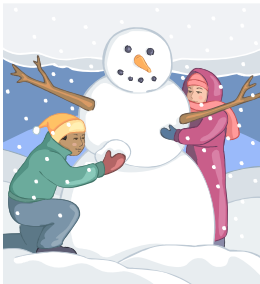
