

This is the first "gain" since 2006 and is only the third in thirteen years.

Assessment Steps for Church of the Brethren Planters

The Commission on Church Development and Evangelism met in May at Coventry CoB where they participated in the Denominational Webinar on assessment steps for potential CoB planters. Nine Districts participated and the Webinar was lead by Craig Whitney, *Church Planter Profiles*, and Jonathan Shivlely, *Congregational Life Ministries*.

The Webinar was interactive and walked us through the four assessment steps for potential planters. I will highlight the step process.

Step 1: initial Screening Assessment

Purpose: to open a conversation between an individual and the district about their potential as a church planter.

Step 2: Build a Profile

Purpose: Gain insight into an individual's personality, behavior, strengths, and spiritual gifting revelant to church planting.

Step 3: Looking at fit/Development fit

Purpose: Determine compatibility between the individual and the Church of the Brethren.

Step 4: Rigorous Examen

Purpose: To determine the health and quality of a candidate's character and commitments as as required for leadership in a church planting context.

You will be hearing more from me in the future about the Assessment Process.

Reflections on Trip to Spain

On my recent trip to visit Spanish Brethren at the beginning of April at the encouragement of the Global Mission Office and my congregation, I observed the celebration of eight church leaders graduating from a Biblical training course that had been held over the last several years. A few students gave testimony of how the studying drew them closer to God and gave them a greater understanding of the Bible and the Church. Each graduate received a certificate signed



by Jay Wittmeyer and a gift of more books to continue their spiritual growth. It was a powerful experience to be part of a prayer for these gifted leaders during a worship service.

After meeting with a variety of church projects in the towns of Madrid, Leon, Oviedo, Aviles, and Gijon, I became convinced that the Church is alive and well. Under the capable leadership of Santos and Rafael Terrero, the mother church, La Luz en Las Naciones (A Light to the Nations), is committed to reaching out to the lost and hurting in their communities and cultivating relationships with groups interested in becoming Brethren. We can join with them in this God-ordained vision by casting our vote to include these groups officially as part of the Church of the Brethren this summer at Annual Conference.

I was so challenged by their determination to carry out the mission of bringing more to Christ in a post-Christian nation—where many do not have time for God—while also providing immigrants with both practical assistance to help them adjust to a new country in a difficult economy and a place to worship and grow in their faith. I was inspired by their warm fellowship and hospitality and will not soon forget their kindness.

2013 Karen H. Kispert Community Service Award Honoree: Indian Creek Church of the Brethren

Members of Indian Creek CoB partnered with Keystone Opportunity Center in 2012 on a pilot project focused on the new "Housing First" permanent housing model. When a property owned by Univest Corp. became available to the program, the renovations required were significant. As Keystone was looking for a way to complete the work on a limited budget, a group at the church was searching for a community mission.

The collaborative effort grew out of the church's ever-increasing awareness of the needs of the community. Many church members ages 13 and up participated in the year-long project. In January, Indian Creek members celebrated with Keystone staff, board members and Univest, Inc. volunteers at a Harbor House Blessing service before the first family moved into its new home in February.
