

District Conference: "Standing on the Promises"

Leffler Chapel, Elizabethtown College - October 4 & 5, 2013



My wife and I enjoy the outdoors, so for us the summers in Pennsylvania are often too short! As I write this article, I am sitting at the foot of Tionesta Lake; I sure hope the Corps of Engineers knew what they were doing when they built this dam. Not far from here are the remains of the Kinzua viaduct, a three-hundred foot high railroad bridge that fell to a tornado in 2003. Why did it fail? The engineers neglected to replace the foundation bolts when it was rebuilt. Whenever I see a tall building or a soaring bridge, I think of the importance of the foundation that lies beneath it, often unseen and unappreciated.

When Cyrus allowed the Israelites to return to Jerusalem to rebuild the temple, they gave their freewill offerings to buy the finest materials to begin the work. Where did they begin: with the foundation, of course. They hired the best masons and carpenters to ensure that the building would be sound, standing on a firm foundation.

Our Biblical text for this year's conference highlights the importance Jesus placed on a strong foundation in our lives. Although He uses the analogy of a building, it is clear that He is telling us that we need a firm foundation so that we do not fall to the winds of temptation that constantly try to blow us down. What better foundation is there than the promises Jesus has made.

Matthew 7: 24-27 is near the end of what is commonly known as the Sermon on the Mount in which Jesus begins with the Beatitudes and continues with the many promises that will be fulfilled if we trust in Him.

PATHWAYS TO PARTNERS

The apostle Paul writes to the Philippians, "I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now." (Philippians 1: 3-5 NIV) Paul obviously felt a sense of gratitude and joy as he delighted in knowing that the church at Philippi was faithfully reaching out in their own local community to share the good news of Jesus with their neighbors and friends. Several members of the Atlantic Northeast District (ANE) Commission on Church Development and Evangelism (CCD&E) recently were able to experience a similar joy and gratitude as they witnessed the faithful work being done by partners in the faith.

ANE is a District blessed with an amazing range of ethnic and cultural diversity. In addition to that ethnic and cultural diversity, ANE also has a wide geographic footprint with a territory that reaches from central Pennsylvania to the beaches of New Jersey and north to the historic areas of New England and the wooded timberlands of Maine.

The CCD&E has been charged with the responsibility to oversee the development of new churches and to assist these groups along the way as they progress to fellowship and then congregational status. In recent years the commission members have increasingly sensed a need to connect with some of our groups that are not geographically close to the hub of District activity.

In November 2012 a trip was planned to Maine and Massachusetts. Those participating included Don Mitchell, Director of Church Development for ANE; three CCD&E members – Ruby Bean, Sandy Christophel, Mary Etta Reinhart; and two spouses Karen Christopel and Ed Reinhart. There was much excitement and anticipation for this trip to be able to see first-hand what was taking place at Sanford and Brunswick (two fellowships in Maine) and Source of Grace (a new project in Boston).



In Maine we visited the Nubble Lighthouse. Maine has many lighthouses, a great symbol for Christians as we are beacons of light to a dark world. Later we met with Wilmer Horst who is the pastor at Sanford. First he took us to a store that sells bulk food and is being operated by members of the Sanford church. The building where Sanford Fellowship meets had been a Kingdom Hall for a Jehovah Witness group. There is a large room for worship on the main floor and the lower level has several classrooms as well as a one-bedroom apartment. They are planning to renovate the downstairs for more classroom space and an area to hold events.

We learned from Pastor Horst that Sanford Fellowship faces many challenges as they work at reaching out to the community. He told us that a large percentage of people in Maine are unchurched. Maine is a mission field that needs to hear the message of Jesus Christ. We were reminded of the lighthouse we saw earlier and that Maine is in need of the light of Christ to shine forth among its residents.

Next we headed north to Brunswick, Maine to visit with Pastor Jim Gould. Pastor Gould is the lead pastor who works with a team of Elders who assist in preaching. Worship services are held at Brunswick and Gardiner Road church located in Wales, Maine. We had been pleased to learn that on the day of our visit the church members were planning to celebrate their Love Feast. We were invited to attend the service of examination that was held in the afternoon. The church was full with families and many children. Pastor Horst from the neighboring Sanford Fellowship led the service of examination. After worship, we had an opportunity to talk with the people and we were amazed to see how our lives intertwine. The Pathways to Partners was alive and we were achieving that which we had set out to do.

The Brunswick Fellowship's Love Feast celebration was being held at the Gardiner Road Church so we headed to Wales for the evening. As commission members, we had been invited to observe the Love Feast that was led by Pastor Wilmer Horst.

Sunday morning we headed to Boston to worship with Source of Grace, one of our newest projects. This group is made up mostly of Haitians led by Pastor Jean Jeune. They meet on the second floor of a house that has a doctor's office on the first floor. We were welcomed as special guests and given seats in the front row. The room was filled with 35 to 40 people and those who could not fit were standing in the hallway and on the steps. A room in the back was filled with children. The Worship was enthusiastic and



God was being glorified. The singing was in English and Creole accompanied by a keyboard, guitar, and drums. As we worshipped with Source of Grace that day, it was apparent to us that this group is in need of a larger facility for worship. Pray that they will be able to find a new place for worship so they can continue to reach out to the community.

The commission members shared their impressions and observations as they travelled back to PA. There was a lot of discussion and insights about the wide variety of styles of worship and the diverse way that the church families we met were able to gather to encourage each other in their faith. Each group is unique and has found ways to build relationships and share the message of Jesus in the communities in which they are located. The commission members sensed the same feeling of gratitude that the Apostle Paul expressed when he wrote to his partners in the faith in Philippi. Distance and cultural diversity may separate us, but we are all partners in sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ.



BDRA Volunteers Assemble 1700 Emergency Clean-Up Buckets in Two Hours ~ Dave Farmer

Why would anyone want to work on a hot summer day? On a Saturday? As a volunteer? For free?

Well, 150 people from the ANE and SoPA Districts did on June 29 at Florin CoB. Ranging in age from 3 years to more than 85, they came in response to a request from Brethren Disaster Ministries in New Windsor, Maryland, whose supply of Emergency Clean-Up Buckets had been depleted following the tornadoes in Texas and Kansas.

The crews completed 1700 Emergency Clean-Up Buckets in less than two hours. That's 14 buckets per minute or one bucket every 4.2 seconds.

The wholesale value of the buckets is \$100,000, paid by the Brethren Disaster Relief Auction. Last year the auction raised over \$500,000 for disaster relief, which includes not only activities such as assembling the Clean-Up Buckets, but also disaster relief trips for volunteers from the organization.
