

Atlantic Northeast District Conference Wrap-Up October 4 - 5, 2013

The forty-fourth Atlantic Northeast District Conference of the Church of the Brethren was held at Elizabethtown College, Leffler Chapel and Performance Center, on October 4 & 5. *Standing on the Promises* was the theme. Moderator was **Thomas Fritz**, member of the Hempfield congregation. Hershey, Spring Creek was the host church for this year's conference. A total of 193 delegates attended, representing 72 out of 80 congregations.

Before Friday evening's worship service, a Minister's Recognition Dinner, hosted by the District Ministry Commission, was held in the Susquehanna Room, Myer Hall. Newly ordained, licensed, interim, and placed ministers were recognized as well as ACTS Graduates. Guest speaker was Stan Dueck.

Friday evening's service of worship and praise was attended by 254. They were inspired by a 55 member district choir, led by Emery Dewitt. Keynote speaker Pete Kontra presented an uplifting message on *"The End of Religion"*. An offering was shared of \$2111.00 for the Barnabas Fund.




Learned from the ANE District Displays

The Barnabas Scripture Focus: Acts 4:33-37

The Barnabas Fund has been established to share the blessing of financial resources with those who express a ministry-driven need. The Fund seeks to encourage the ministry of congregations through a grant-based ministry investment strategy that seeks Kingdom-based ministry results through: shared resources, fiscal accountability, ministry planning, and economic partnering.

Proposed Funding Process:

- □ Funding for the Barnabas Fund will primarily be through:
 - o Barnabas Funding line item in the Commission on Witness & Outreach Ministry Investment Plan.
 - o Donations from individuals and churches.

Current Support Process:

- □ Supporting the following "mission congregations" through Mission Church Support Fund & the District's Ministry Investment Plan:
 - o Alpha & Omega (Lancaster, PA)
- o Brooklyn First (Brooklyn, NY)
- o Germantown (Philadelphia, PA)
- o Harrisburg First (Harrisburg, PA)

Proposed Support

- □ Establish the Barnabas Fund in order to serve the ministry of a wider constituency of churches with ministry and financial needs similar to the original four "mission congregations".
- ☐ The Barnabas Fund will sustain the financial support for the ministry of the current four "mission" congregations" in 2014.
- □ Additional congregations meeting the Barnabas Fund guidelines may apply for grants in 2014.
- □ In 2015 and beyond All Barnabas Fund grants will be based on an Application Process.

 - o Sizeable community needs that surpass the congregation's ability to respond.
- ☐ There must be clear evidence of Gospel and Mission.
- □ The Barnabas Fund shall not be used to:
 - o Compensate for poor stewardship practices
 - o Compensate for deferred maintenance
 - o Sustain an "inwardly" focused congregation seeking survival.

2013 MINISTRY INVESTMENT PLAN

Year to date as of September 30, 57 supportive congregations have contributed \$368,476 and individuals have given \$500. This brings our total giving for the Ministry Investment Plan (MIP) to date to **\$368,976.** This is a little more than half way to our 2013 MIP goal.

Our Goal for 2013 is to receive an additional \$265,398 by <u>December 31, 2013</u> and to have 100% of our congregations and fellowships contributing to ANE's Ministry Investment Plan goal of \$634,374. Through ANE'S MIP we are networking together in Kingdom-building beyond what any one congregation can do alone. These ministries are made possible <u>solely</u> from contributions from ANE congregations and members.

At this time of the year as we pause to reflect on our bountiful blessings and the greatest Gift given to the world, *please consider being a faithful partner in ANE's ministries*. Your prayers and contributions will help sustain and grow these ministries.

Free Popcorn, provided by Reist Popcorn Company owned by David and Pam Reist from the Elizabethtown Church of the Brethren, was labeled with the slogan "War hurts children and their Mommies and Daddies."

Camp Swatara Travels to Acadia National Park



Why is the area around Bar Harbor and Acadia National Park called Downeast Maine? In 2014 you will have the opportunity to not only learn the meaning of "Downeast," but also experience firsthand the wonders and beauty of this area where the "waters meet the forests." From September 5-14 Camp Swatara is sponsoring a trip to Acadia National Park and the surrounding area. Ray and Judy Powell, who have co-led this trip for the past

seven years, have more than 30 years of experience exploring the Park. Activities will include nature discovery walks and boat rides, as well as a carriage ride through the Park. Park Ranger presentations will be included on several of these discoveries. Sightings of deer, eagles, seals and beaver are common. (Sorry, no moose, but you never know.) There will also be a stop at the famous Jordan Pond House to eat popovers and time to explore the shops of Bar Harbor.

Housing accommodations in Maine are in 2-3 bedroom cottages located on the water's edge at Clark's Cove outside of Bar Harbor (www.seasidemaine.com). Each cottage is comfortably furnished and includes private bedrooms (double occupancy), as well as a shared bath, kitchen and living room. Travel to and from Acadia is by two Camp vans and overnight accommodations while traveling are in 3-star hotels included in the cost of the trip. The estimated cost is \$875-950 per person. This cost includes all housing accommodations, transportation, tickets, all breakfasts and the dinner/ supper meal while in Maine. Space is limited to no more than 18 persons.
