
Gifts Discernment for District Leadership

From the Commission on Witness and Outreach

Quakertown Church of the Brethren's *Heaven's Bounty Food Pantry* was started over 15 years ago. Open two days a week, Tuesdays and Thursdays see increased foot traffic for the church as people come to receive blessings in a physical form. Almost tripling the previous number, *Heaven's Bounty* now serves approximately 100 families per month, with family size varying.

Heaven's Bounty is supported by so many organizations and people alike. The church houses the pantry, volunteers run this ministry, government provides food and funding, other grocery stores, gas stations, and farms provide additional donations, and God provides the energy and blessing to make it all run smoothly. What exactly is outreaching and witnessing, one might ask, especially when a food pantry can't outwardly speak of God because of separation of church and state? To Heaven's Bounty, it is about meeting a need, it is about giving a drink of cold water, it is about planting a seed that God and other situations can water and help grow. Out of such service has come new life, new abundance, and new grace in Christ, for which we are thankful.

An additional increase in clients is also expected with decreasing food stamps. With *Heaven's Bounty's* ever increasing client pool, any additional resources would be incredibly helpful. Following an intense outbreak of thunderstorms and tornadoes that heavily impacted Illinois and Indiana on Nov. 17, Brethren Disaster Ministries is preparing to be involved as needed in those states.

Brethren Disaster Ministries is supporting Church World Service (CWS) efforts to provide disaster recovery training for communities hit by the tornadoes and material aid shipments such as Emergency Clean-up Buckets, Hygiene Kits, Baby Care Kits, School Kits, and CWS blankets.

Annual Conference Registration

The 2014 Annual Conference will be in Columbus, OH, from July 2-6.

Delegate and non-delegate fees will remain the same for 2014, but new this year is no registration fee for children and youth, high school age and younger.

Early delegate registration begins January 2 and continues through February 25 at the rate of \$285, after which it goes up to \$310. Early registration for non-delegates begins February 26. The cost is \$105 for adults who register for the full Conference, with a daily fee of \$35 available, and discounts for young adults post high school through age 21 and active Brethren Volunteer Service workers. After June 3, non-delegate registration is only available onsite for an increased fee.

Peter Becker Community, has recently partnered with Home Helpers of Lansdale, the area's leading home care provider, in a move to enhance choices and meet the changing needs of community members. LITITZ CHURCH OF THE BRETHREN CELEBRATES 100 YEARS

The Lititz Church of the Brethren will be celebrating its 100th anniversary as a self-supporting congregation in 2014. The congregation was chartered on January 10, 1914 with 119 members. The first meeting house was located on Willow Street in Lititz. The congregation moved to a new meeting house on Center Street in 1926 and relocated to its present site on West Orange Street in 1962.

A year-long celebration will take place beginning with a worship service of music and the spoken word on Sunday afternoon, January 12 at 3:00 PM with members of the parent congregation, the Middle Creek Church of the Brethren, participating. The choirs of both churches will provide music plus ongregational singing from the 1901 Brethren Hymnal.

On February 2 a Sunday morning heritage worship service will be held at 9:00 AM in the style of worship from 1914 with **Ralph Moyer** preaching.

Throughout the year former pastors will be preaching at worship services including **Arlin Claassen** on April 6, **Jimmy Ross** on August 3, and **Pam Reist** on November 2.

A celebration weekend including a video produced for the anniversary and fellowship meal will be held on May 3 and a worship service on May 4 with **Earl Ziegler** preaching.

Bethany Seminary president, **Jeff Carter**, will preaching at the October 19 worship service as the congregation looks to the future.

The anniversary theme is *Following In the Steps of Jesus...A Century of Ministry...a Future of Promise.* All are invited to worship with the members and friends of the Lititz Church of the Brethren. Sunday worship services are held at 9:00 AM(traditional) & 9:15 AM(contemporary).
