



Advent Bible School at Spring Creek CoB, Hershey

Bible school at Christmas time? Who would have thought that would work?!?! It did! And think about it... Is there a better time to share the Good News??? During advent this year, Spring Creek CoB offered an "Advent Bible School" on Saturdays.

The curriculum for Bible school was based on the Go Fish Guys' Christmas curriculum called "The Gift of Advent". In addition to the bible stories and lessons, the children enjoyed a craft, snack, games, and time to memorize bible verses. What is Ministry Summer Service?

Ministry Summer Service (MSS) is a leadership development program for college students in the Church of the Brethren who spend 10 weeks of summer working in the church (local congregation, district office, camp, or national program).

Why Ministry Summer Service?

Congregations may ask, "Why should we take on a summer intern?" Young adults may ask, "Why should we work for the church for a whole summer?"

The answer has to do with God's call. The Bible is a record of God calling people to challenging tasks. MSS is no exception. Through MSS, God is calling congregations to reach out in the ministry of teaching and receiving. God is calling young adults to explore the possibility of church work as their vocation.

It's perhaps the cruelest irony of ministry: caring for the souls of others can be hard on your own. Those of us who spend our days leading, teaching, counseling, equipping, and encouraging others, too often neglect our own spiritual health. That's why we've created **Soul Health for Spiritual Leaders**. This 38-page resource features wisdom and practical advice from ministry leaders on how to assess and nurture your spiritual health. It also emphasizes the importance of developing spiritual health so you can continue ministering effectively to others.

Faith-Building Experience

Two groups of volunteers traveled to the Dominican Republic in December and January to help build a church in La Descubierta. The project received funding from Brethren World Mission, the Mission and Ministry Board and



both volunteer groups. "Not only was the physical church built," said Carolyn Fitzkee, "but working alongside others who spoke a different language for a common purpose was also a faith-building experience. Prayers and songs sung and translated into English, Spanish, and Kreyol were heavenly."

Coordinated by Earl Ziegler, a group of 12 volunteers from the Lititz, Lampeter, Curryville, and Conewago congregations in Pennsylvania completed latrines and a concrete roof during the week of December 7-14. The second group, comprised of 18 from the Chiques congregation, and seven from Rockford (IL) Community congregation and led by Carolyn Fitzkee and Jeff Boshart, traveled from January 4 to 11. They helped complete the concrete floor, paint, and began work on a cistern.

Both groups also spent time with the children of the community. The first group provided coloring books and crayons for about 40 children and a few adults. The second group, in partnership with Dominican pastors Anastacia Bueno (San Luis) and Cristina Lamu Bueno (Sabana Torsa), provided an abbreviated three-day Vacation Bible School. The pastors coordinated the songs and spiritual content, while the US group led games and craft activities. The first day 50 children attended under the pavilion next to the church. The second day the group went to the local school in town; the central location attracted 300 children! On the final day, 60 children—including some not affiliated with the congregation--came to the church for activities and a concluding worship.

Located near the border with Haiti, La Descubierta is a community comprised primarily of Haitian immigrants. Pastor Sauveur Charles is the spiritual leader, but also helped coordinate the work project. Impromptu times of worship inside the church were a highlight for both groups.

Gran Bwa Medical Clinic


A group of volunteers comprised of 18 people from the Chiques congregation, and seven from Rockford (IL) Community Church helped provide a one-day medical clinic for 339 patients at the largest CoB congregation in Haiti on January 9. The Gran Bwa congregation is located in a remote mountainous area of Haiti near the border of the Dominican Republic. The group rode on the back of Daihatsu pick-up truck up a very rocky, steep, and windy "road" for 2 1/2 hours, and then hiked for nearly 2 hours to get to the church. A group from the Haiti side spent nearly a day getting to Gran Bwa.

Part of the Haiti Medical Mission, the clinic was coordinated by Brother Jean Altenor of the National Committee of the Haitian CoB, Pastor Duverlus Altenor, and Ilexene and Michaela Alphonse. The US group provided a doctor (Dr. Paul Brubaker, Chiques) and four nurses; the Dominican church provided an optometrist (Pastor Onelys Rivas, Betel); and the Haiti Medical Project provided two Haitian doctors and a nurse, plus translators and supplies.

Brother Jean said it was hard to put into words how much it meant for this community to be ministered to in this way, knowing the sacrifice. He said the church was "hungry" for this clinic which was very evident from the turnout.

"Being able to serve alongside and minister to our brothers and sisters in Christ," said Chiques group leader Carolyn Fitzkee, "was truly a mountaintop experience."



Historic Middle Creek Church of the Brethren 150[™] ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION 1864-2014 "Celebrating Our Past – Focused on the Future"

We've been meeting here at Middle Creek since about 1769, but it wasn't until 1864 that we actually became a separate congregation from the mother church – the Conestoga Church of the Brethren. As we mark this significant milestone of 150 years, our Planning Committee has come up with various ways to celebrate throughout 2014.

The Writing of our Church History – Five writers from our congregation have written a comprehensive "History of the Middle Creek Church", a book with more than seventy pictures in addition to the text. This book will be available in time for our May 2014 Love Feast.

Spring Love Feast – We became a separate congregation from Conestoga on May 5, 1864. This year we will celebrate the "official" sesquicentennial at our Spring Love Feast, the weekend of May 3-4. Saturday evening, Don Fitzkee of the Chiques congregation, will officiate at the Love Feast, assisted by Ivan Lutz, our most senior emeritus minister. Sunday morning during the Sunday School hour, Don Fitzkee will present a "Brethren/Middle Creek History Lesson" to the combined adult classes in the sanctuary. During the worship service, the "Snyder Sisters" (5 sisters who all grew up in our congregation) will provide the special music, and District Executive, Craig Smith, will bring the morning message. A Fellowship Meal will follow the service.

Historical Tour – Sunday afternoon, May 4, we will have a chance to tour places of historical significance in our congregation's past using two chartered buses.

Fall Celebration – On Sunday, October 19, there will be a special fall celebration from 9:30-11:00 AM in our church sanctuary. Included in the worship service will be lots of music, interviews with persons in various age groups, testimonies, and a slide show. Following morning worship there will be a congregational meal in the Fellowship Hall.

Wall of Memories – Along with the above events, we also plan to create a "Wall of Memories" in the church narthex. Members are encouraged to bring pictures of special events that have taken place in the past at Middle Creek Church, weddings, baptisms, special programs, class activities, etc.

PRAYER SEMINAR




