Leffler Chapel, Elizabethtown College - October 4, 2014




In 1966, I attended NYC at Cornell University in Ithaca, NY. When I returned, I remember telling my friends and family that National Youth Conference was a "mountaintop" experience for me. My earlier "mountaintop" experiences were at Camp Swatara, particularly during vespers and sacred campfires. At both NYC and camp, I felt inspired to love and serve Christ, connected to God and others in a deeper sense, and somehow different for having been there. I was reluctant to return home, aware of the difficulty, perhaps impossibility, of holding on to those feelings and experiences. I knew even then that much of life is lived on the flat places and in the valleys. Yet I yearn for the mountaintops: inspiration, deep connectedness, and transformation.

Perhaps few (if any) would describe District Conference as a "mountaintop" experience. However, when the church is gathered together in the Spirit of Christ and for His purposes, there are possibilities for inspiration, deep connectedness, and transformation. Let us pray that at District Conference, we experience the presence of those possibilities.

Inspiration: Worship at District Conference will focus on the theme, *Building up the body of CHRIST*, based upon Ephesians 4:11-16. Mark Wenger, Director of Pastoral Studies at Eastern Mennonite Seminary (Lancaster), will lead a Bible study at 7:30 a.m. At 1:30 p.m. a special worship service is planned. The Lancaster CoB Tour Choir "Singing Our Faith", led by Emery DeWitt, will provide special music. Paul Mundey, pastor of the Frederick, MD church, will preach the message, *The Drumbeat of Love*, while Dave Weiss, conference logo designer, portrays the message in a live painting. We will both hear and see the message preached. Together in worship, let us glorify God and "Build up the body of CHRIST."

Graduated from Hempfield and planning to attend the one-year program at Miracle Mountain Ranch School of Discipleship, hopefully working in the media department.



Where is the Love?

On June 20, '2014, my wife Pastor Belita and I set off on a journey to connect with our brothers and sisters in New York.

We wanted to be at the opening celebration of *Light of the Gospel Fellowship* in their new building. As many of you know, this is an Arabic-speaking body of believers hailing from Egypt, Lebanon, Syria and Israel. Praise the Lord! They have been together for over seven years and previously shared worship space at Brooklyn First CoB. Pastor Milad Samaan is the under shepherd of this vibrant worshipping community. Core leaders of the congregation, Akram and Amal Said, were former members of Brooklyn First for over twenty-five years and continue in faithful leadership with the new fellowship. The Building they purchased is located in Staten Island, NY. Most of the members reside in this Borough.

It was a pleasure connecting with our Brothers and Sisters once again, and being in their new Building seemed to raise spirits to heights that cannot be measured.

The Saturday gathering included nearly 300. People came from PA, NJ, DE, and NY. Belita and I had no idea the Arabic Clergy and Christian Community was so large. Clergy from the tri-state area brought words of encouragement, affirmation and blessings. I brought greetings from the Atlantic Northeast District and District Executive, Craig H. Smith. Pastor Belita of Harrisburg First Church brought greetings on behalf of ethnic and urban congregations within ANE. As a past Annual Conference Moderator, she also brought affirmation and encouragement on behalf of our denomination as we endeavor to become a more intercultural body of believers. It was indeed a high time of joyful, worshipful celebration. There was a resounding expression of love and Christian fellowship.

On Sunday, June 22, we found ourselves on Long Island in the Bayshore area where we worshipped with *The Potter's House project*. This is a Spanish-speaking group established by pastors Gilberto and Graciela Falu.

We were warmly greeted and thought our visit would have us in the seats worshiping with our guests. The Lord had another plan. Pastor Falu asked me would I be preaching, in that guest ministers normally bring the word. I indicated to Brother Falu "I'm not the preacher—she (Pastor Belita) is". Brother Falu quickly moved over to my wife and extended the invitation to deliver the morning message behind the Holy Desk. To my surprise and Pastor Falu's, Belita said "Yes". Wow! What a time we all had in praising the Lord and being challenged by Pastor Belita in her impromptu, inspired word from God. Men were rejoicing, women were in tears, and after the sermon the entire Congregation of over 50 came forward for continued prayer, words of assurance, and anointing. It certainly was a love fest for Jesus as we celebrated the powerful presence of the Holy Spirit.

Where is the Love? The love is in us, among us, and shared between us, when we all come together to worship and praise our God across ethnic and cultural boundaries. The experiences we had are the stuff that makes for "creating spiritually healthy New Testament congregations who covenant and network together to further the Kingdom of God."

This moment in rejoicing with our brothers and sisters will be cherished by all for many years to come.

Oasis is a fellowship of women 25 years and older. Their aim: that God uses Oasis to strengthen relationships to Him, to build community in His church, and to enlarge His Kingdom. "Look at the new thing I am going to do. It is already happening. Don't you see it? I will make a road in the desert and rivers in the dry land." (Isaiah 43:19) is their Oasis theme verse.

Oasis began in October 2009 with an evening titled: "Joy For The Journey." Since then there have been 32 meetings, with an additional number of times to connect, including small group meetings - - which just began this year. Oasis has brought together dozens of woman from various churches including: Baptist, Lutheran, Presbyterian, Catholic, the Vineyard, Brethren, and even those who are not part of God's family.

The following are responses from Oasis participants – in their own words:

- "Oasis is a cool drink of refreshing water and I look forward to coming and try to plan to do so. There is no other group that I'm in or have been in that I feel such joy and welcoming."
- "Oasis means ladies bonding for fellowship, teaching & fun! Laughter is an important piece of life and Oasis provides that with love, acceptance and belonging."
- "A time of renewal, fellowship, and friendship with other women of like precious faith in Christ. It also means a way of inviting other women to experience what joy and friendship can mean thru Christ."
- "Oasis seems to be in my blood."

Seasons have come and gone since the beginning of Oasis. We have met new friends and have grown closer to old ones. Together we have talked, laughed, cried, prayed, traveled, sung, and encouraged and we have experienced the bonding of friendship and the warmth of community. Together we have focused on God and have learned about being more like Him. Oasis has been instrumental in the growth and strengthening of the church. God is doing great things! Please pray for this ministry of the Lewiston CoB. Leaders are Jen Keller and Melody Keller.

A Quick Glance at ANE's Ministry Investment Plan

Year to date as of 6/30/14

To date in 2014 we celebrate:

The District Executive and the Ministry Commission are currently overseeing ministerial training for nearly 60 Licensed Ministers, have newly ordained 5 persons, and have provided administrative oversight for more than 240 Ordained Ministers.

More than \$36,000 was provided as "direct" or grant support for urban congregations and Family Life Center outreach. This amount is <u>significantly increased</u> by adding "indirect" gifts such as: volunteer hours, gifts *in kind*, individual donations, congregationally-designated gifts, and special congregational grants.

Church planting is strong. Church plant projects are continuing to develop: *The Potter's House (Hispanic)* in Long Island, NY, *Source of Grace (Haitian)* in Boston, MA, and *Iglesia Restauracion Divina (Hispanic)* in Reading, PA. Projects are working towards *Fellowship* status. Fellowships are maturing and moving to *Congregational* status. This is good news for sharing the Good News!

Strong senior high and junior high youth ministry events, networking and discussion groups, NYC, NOAC, work camps, disaster relief efforts, increased levels of coaching, stewardship education, ministry to senior adults, retreats, continuing education opportunities, international ministry exchanges, vital training partnerships with: Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center, Bethany Theological Seminary, the Brethren Academy for Ministerial Leadership, and a variety of local ministry-training institutions is strong, and . . . much, much MORE!

To date the fiscal investment in these ministries has been \$286,363.

ANE staff celebrates and sincerely thanks all individuals and congregations who have contributed both through volunteer time and financially. Without this support, these ministries would not have happened!

Our concern:

To date our income is \$52,761 short of our expenses. Thirty-three percent (33%) of ANE congregations, fellowships, and projects have not yet contributed to our common district ministry. *Please urge your congregations as members of the ANE family to celebrate and support these ministries with a financial gift.*

While there are many good things that are happening "out there," please remember that there are scores of wonderful and meaningful ministries taking place right here in our ANE's backyard.

Blessings to all as we work together in growing His Kingdom.
