



Seven Questions to Advance Your Church

- 1. What steps will you take to make a positive and faithful impact on your community?

- 7. Who is your ministry trying to please?

Asking better questions leads to healthier solutions; and healthier solutions lead to a clearer vision; and a clearer vision leads to a brighter future; and a bright future is God's energy for today and ray of hope for tomorrow.

Dear ANE Congregations and Leaders:

At the District Board Meeting in June, board members and staff learned that Congregational Giving to ANE is **exceptionally low** at this time of year. This shortfall is painting a bleak fiscal picture for our summer. I am writing to ask several things:

Barnabas Fund Update

Harrisburg First

The Barnabas Fund Team met in early May to determine 2016 funding based on requests received from ANE district churches. Alpha & Omega, Brooklyn First, Germantown, and Harrisburg First were all offered funding for 2016 contingent upon approval, from the ANE District Board and the ANE District Conference in October, of the 2016 Ministry Investment Plan.

As those requests for funding were reviewed, there were some wonderful success stories shared of kingdom work being done in our local churches. Here is a success story that was shared with the Barnabas Fund team by Belita Mitchell, pastor of Harrisburg First CoB.

Two of eight persons baptized last year were single mothers who were residents of a local mission shelter. One has an infant son who is growing up before our very eyes and being embraced by the entire congregation. The other woman was separated from her three-year-old daughter who was in temporary foster care. Their desire to grow closer to God and to connect with our congregation led to the resurgence of our transportation ministry, as they had no means to get to church other than taking a taxi.

We have been able to serve up to 12 persons each week using our church van and volunteer drivers. The two new members in the congregation have been blessed with changed living arrangements moving them closer to self-sufficiency. The one mother in particular has been accepted into a BHA program and is now reunited with her three-year-old. The other mother has been moved into a more independent level housing within the mission structure and is returning to HACC (Harrisburg Area Community College) to further her education. Because of their fervor and changed lives, they are actively inviting others to come and see what God can do in their lives too. This kind of enthusiasm and growing faith has seen our 11:15 service gain in regular attendance which now exceeds the number in attendance at our traditional service.

The Harrisburg First congregation is being supported by the ANE District Barnabas Fund with a \$10,000 annual commitment in 2015. This is just one more way that our ANE district congregations are able to work together to enable congregations with identifiable needs to more productively offer successful outreach and evangelism ministries in their communities.

Outreach Update

As members of the Witness and Outreach Commission interact with congregations in our district, we often hear stories of ways that our churches are reaching out to their communities. This outreach sometimes takes place in the form of an organized program. At other times, outreach is a result of seeing and meeting a community need. This month we are highlighting the Prayer Shawl Ministry of the Swatara Hill congregation:

The ladies of the Swatara Hill congregation have been involved in a prayer shawl ministry for several years. This provides the ladies an opportunity to come together for a time of fellowship while creating shawls for members of the larger community. The shawls are prayed over while being created and then blessed during a Sunday morning service. As members of the congregation see a need, which may include illness, a new birth, divorce, or any other time of trouble, a shawl is selected and presented to the individual. As they wrap the shawl about themselves, there is a symbolic wrapping of God's arms around them. Normally this brings about peace and provides comfort to a hurting spirit.
