

The 47th annual ANE District Conference is scheduled for Saturday, October 8, at the Leffler Chapel at Elizabethtown College. The theme for this year's conference is *Fixing Our Eyes on Jesus* based upon Hebrews 12:1-3. In these days when we find ourselves distracted by national politics, a world and even our own neighborhoods torn by violence, cultural issues which divide our nation and the church, the Scripture calls us to "throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles," to "not grow weary and lose heart," but to "run with perseverance the race marked out for us," fixing our eyes on Jesus "the author and perfecter of our faith..."

As those who have been reconciled to God through Christ, we have been given a unique and vital message for our world today: "that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ...and has committed to us the message of reconciliation. We are therefore Christ's ambassadors..." (2 Corinthians 5:18-20). If we are to be Christ's ambassadors bringing God's message of reconciliation, peace and hope, our eyes must be fixed on Jesus, learning from him, growing in him and open to his call to go and be his ambassadors in our neighborhoods, our schools, our workplaces and in the world. No one else will do it. We're the ones so called.

The goal, as always, is that every congregation in our District will be represented at the conference. The opening roll call will include photos of the people of each congregation which will serve as a visual reminder of the "cloud of witnesses" that makes up the ANE District. Jeff Carter, President of Bethany Theological Seminary, will be the preacher for the worship which will follow lunch. The conference is open to all, so invite members of your congregation to attend and participate.

Dinner in the Park

Last summer, an ambitious group of young families who usually meet on Sunday mornings as a Sunday School class at Mechanic Grove CoB decided to try out a new challenge. They had been talking in their class about ways to step out of their comfort zone to meet families with needs in their community. They had heard stories of churches who offered free meals to the community and who never kept any of the leftover food...it was all handed out.

A decision was made to offer free meals at Huffnagle Park, a local neighborhood park in Quarryville, every Wednesday evening over the summer months. The local Food Bank was contacted and asked to share an invitation to this free meal with all of their clients, including the families of children participating in the "Student Weekend Eating Program" (SWEEP) at their local elementary schools.

This was quite a leap of faith for these young families with young children and limited finances. The responsibility for cooking the weekly meals was handled by four different persons with each taking a specific week. Others in the group chipped in to help. The cooking was done in the state health department approved kitchen at Mechanic Grove (a requirement for this project). The children of these young families enjoyed playing together at the church under the occasional supervision of the youth in the church while their parents cooked in the kitchen.

When the meal was ready to be served, the food was transported to the Park. Fortunately, they never ran out of food. They were actually able to give away leftovers to the families participating in the meal by using disposable trays. Attendance varied over the summer. One week they actually were able to serve 70 persons. Anyone who happened to be at the park when the meal was served was invited to join in with those who had come intentionally for the meal.

There were some "interesting" experiences that took place over the course of these summer meals. Near the end of the summer, a homeless mother and her daughter who were living in their car at the park joined in for the simple meal. At another time they were approached by another family in the process of being evicted from their home. The Mechanic Grove congregation was able to help both of these families find housing in time for their children to enroll for school in the Solanco School District in September.

The Dinner in the Park effort may be offered again this summer. The young families involved felt the effort was meaningful and made a difference to all those involved. What a marvelous example of going out into the World!




