ANE DISTRICT CONFERENCE

District Conference 2020 marked a historical moment for ANE. Over 140 gathered online on October 2 for our Worship Service that was Livestreamed from the District Office through Microsoft Teams. This platform enabled our brothers and sisters get real time closed captioning in English, Spanish, Arabic and Korean.

Karen Hackett, Moderator, prepared the service which included music from Ryan Arndt from West Green Tree CoB. Harrisburg First's Praise Band, led by Josiah Ludwick brought the eclectic sounds of their congregation supplying us with a twist to some traditional songs as well as a Spanish piece. We thank them for their time and effort to make the service meaningful and personal.

Those attending also learned of the District's Service Project – bcmPEACE. It is a nonprofit

organization that serves the South Allison Hill Community of Harrisburg, and founded by Harrisburg First CoB. Between



online and mailed in donations, the District was able to give bcmPEACE \$1,261. Thank you for your generous gifts.

Eric Landram, Pastor at Lititz COB, provided a message based on Psalm



46, encouraging us to Be still, let go and know God. He challenged us to embrace the Way Forward initiative presented by the District Board, to listen to each other, and to be honest about what is happening within our District and Denomination. He also encouraged us to remember for a people living in troubled times that God is our safe place. He is where our power and hope come from.

District Executive, Pete Kontra celebrated our ministers during a time of Ministry Recognition. George Snavely of the Elizabethtown congregation was honored for his 50 years in Ministry.

The 2020 District Conference business session on Saturday, October 3 was also held online and livestreamed through Microsoft Teams. Over 150 people attended which included both Delegates and Non-Delegates. Brothers and Sisters gathered for 4 + hours to worship and do important District business. The event included both live and pre-recorded information.

All-in-all it was a good event. Was it the best way to gather? It was for 2020. We had our share of technical difficulties, but the goal of providing Conference in the most affordable, efficient and meaningful way was achieved. We look forward to hosting the next District Conference on October 1 & 2, 2021—however that might look like.

The Program & Arrangements Committee meet in November to start to plan for next year.

A total of 16 different and varied leaders and speakers shared their thoughts and words of encouragement.

A major highlight of this two day event was an interview with President George W. Bush.

Here are some of the comments shared by our ANE church leaders who were a part of this GLS Summit:

<u>Craig Groeschel</u> always seems to hit home with me. Two take-away statements include:

- 1. I serve a Leader who knows how to lead through the dip.
- 2. People don't hate change, they hate the way we MAKE the change.

I appreciated the interview with <u>George Bush</u> who said, "Have faith that the power of the Gospel will always prevail.

<u>Vanessa Van Edwards</u> talked about good leaders having both warmth and competence. Some people are very human and not very efficient. Some people are very competent but come across as a machine.

<u>T.D. Jakes</u> share these interesting thoughts: Meet in the center of the square - black or white, male or female

 Build a coalition that you can't control (have a conversation where the AMENs don't come easy).

- Sit at the table with someone who has a perspective you can't teach. Become a student.
- 3. Find what connects you rather than what divides you.

Next year, the Global Leadership Summit is scheduled for August 5 and 6, 2021. Mark your calendars for this powerful 2 day opportunity to grow and be encouraged in your life and ministry!

ANE DISASTER RESPONSE UPDATE Volunteers Welcome & Needed!



The Bad News:

Many people are aware that the work sites for Brethren Disaster Ministries were forced to close due to COVID 19 crisis earlier this year. Many volunteers who had hoped to be able to serve at these work sites were forced to change and cancel their plans to serve in this way.

The Good News:

Brethren Disaster Ministries work sites are now open and ready to receive volunteers. Now that the sites are open again, there is a significant shortage of volunteers to serve at these work sites. Persons in the ANE District who would like to use their gifts to serve at a Brethren Disaster Ministries work site are now being encourage to volunteer.

There are openings for work weeks in the upcoming weeks of 2020. And there are also lots of openings for your church group to volunteer for a week in 2021. Now is the time to begin to schedule those trips.

Jenn Dorsch Messler, Director of Brethren Disaster Ministries, has these words to share for those who may be hesitant to spend a week at a BDM work site during this time of pandemic restrictions:

"We are finding that volunteers who have served on our sites since July are reflecting that they have felt very safe when they have served because everyone has been diligent with following safety precautions. The protocol in place to protect all involved with the site have helped them to be more at ease even if they were anxious in advance. We thank those who have served and worked so hard to keep our sites as safe as possible but also honor those who are concerned about health issues and are not able to travel right now. We are also open to answering any questions that volunteers may have"

Jenn has also shared these helpful scheduling details for those interested in volunteering:

2020 Schedule:

As we look at the end of 2020, we are currently now back to running two rebuilding sites that are hosting overnight volunteers. One site is in Dayton, Ohio, continuing with the tornado recovery. The newly opened site is the Coastal NC project in Pamlico County, N.C., completing Hurricane Florence recovery. Both sites are planned to stay open through the end of 2020, as the COVID-19 environment allows, and are still welcoming volunteers.

Here are the dates that remain open in 2020. All at the new Coastal NC Site:

Nov 15-21, 2020 Nov 29- Dec 5, 2020 Dec 6-12, 2020

2021 Schedule:

Primarily due to the lower numbers of weekly volunteers and leaders comfortable going out right now, we will only be able to sustain one rebuilding site for the beginning of 2021. After weighing many dynamics on both sites, the only option for serving on a BDM national site for January, February, and March 2021 will be at the Coastal NC site.

The national BDM Dayton, Ohio, site will be paused during those three months though there are local BDM volunteers and other local groups who plan to continue to work as the weather allows. In April we will plan to close the Coastal NC site and resume the national site in Dayton with the expectation for the work there to continue at least through the end of 2021.

This is a new world we are navigating to balance the concern of serving and our call to help those in need. We thank those who have served and worked so hard to keep our sites as safe as possible and honor those who are concerned about health issues and are not able to travel right now. We are blessed by all the prayers and support you have shared and thank you for your continued support.

The ANE District hosted a luncheon gathering of some of our ANE District licensed and ordained women in ministry on Tuesday, August 18. The



women gathered at noon via ZOOM for a time of virtual lunch (bring your own!), fellowship and sharing. Those in attendance heard Susan Eikenberry share some of her thoughts about the Hebrew word "ezer" that we see in Genesis 2:18. God told Adam that he needed a helper — an "ezer" - because it was not good for man to be alone. Sue reminded us that the Hebrew word, "ezer" almost always refers to God as the "ezer" — mighty help, shield and deliverer in the Old Testament.


