Conference weekend started on Thursday, September 30, with on-line Bible Study focused on Paul's Letter to the church at Colosse. The study focused specifically on the theme of Be Renewed in Christ through application of Colossians 3.

Chossians The weekend continued on Friday, October 1, with a hybrid Worship

Service. Brian Messler, Ephrata Church of the Brethren, challenged us through asking questions: If we believe Jesus is enough; if we are maturing through becoming more like Christ every day; and if we remember scripture as easily we remember commercial jingles. Specifically, if we are continually setting our hearts on the realities of heaven, taking off our old nature and putting on our new nature, as instructed in Colossians 3. On Saturday October 2, a hybrid morning and afternoon Business Session was held at Leffler Chapel. The morning session included business items of a celebratory nature. Ebenezer Project was approved to become a Fellowship and Un Nuevo Renacer was approved to become a Congregation. Mount Zion Road and Brunswick's disorganizations were also approved, and a prayer was offered to all congregations and fellowships that have chosen to separate from the Church of the Brethren. The Way Forward Shepherding Team organized to guide ANE implementation of the Way Forward Process, provided an overview of the process, background as well as of what actions ANE congregations and members were being requested to take.

There was a time to renew and build new relationships over lunch followed by the opportunity to participate in one of two insight sessions. "Cultivating a Culture of Call and Why it Matters" insight session was led by Joe Dietrik on the importance of calling out ministers. The other insight session continued the conversation on the Way Forward Process. There were many challenging questions from the floor. Due to time constraints, not all




questions were able to be addressed and had to be taken away by the Way Forward Shepherding Team to process together. The conversation and questions demonstrated the need for continued

Afghan Evacuee Resettlement

New CWS Kits: CWS is also welcoming donations of and for a new Welcome Backpack Kit. CWS Welcome Backpacks are a new part of the process providing unaccompanied minors and families with the essentials for their transition: food and water, children's activities, a blanket, basic hygiene items, and PPE. If you care not able to assemble these kits at home but still want to support them, you can also donate to CWS for them to be created and distributed. Haiti Earthquake Rebuilding: BDM is still in close communication with the Haitian Church of the Brethren about the earthquake response and recovery efforts in the Saut Mathurine community where the only Church of the Brethren in the south is located. There will be more details included in our upcoming BRIDGES newsletter including a poster that can be shared.

In the meantime, here are some initial estimates about what a donation to the response can support:

\$7,000 – Materials and labor for a new home \$75 - Monthly food kits for a family \$30 - Water filter for a household \$38,000 - New 4 door truck in Haiti





ANE District Fills New Ministry Position

Indian Creek Kicks off Organ Donor Awareness Program

There is an unmet need for living and deceased organ and tissue donors. As Brethren, you are called to help fill that need. Living donors have the best success rates and anyone who can be one is in a very unique position to share the gift of life. We can all be organ and tissue donors—there is no age limit.

On September 12, 2021 Indian Creek held the official kick-off for their Organ Donor Awareness (ODA) Program. Pete Kontra, District Executive attended. "I was privileged to attend and was given the opportunity to introduce the Church of the Brethren's 1993 Resolution on Organ and Tissue Donation, which encourages individuals and congregations to develop awareness and participate in this ministry to those in need. Particularly is the encouragement for Pastors and Deacons to prepare themselves to provide spiritual support to those they care for should the need arise. Bob Lane, member of the ODA Team shares his personal commitment, and encourages you to adapt these words to your own situation and beliefs so that your family and medical team know your wishes:

As a Christian, I accept and believe that at the moment of my death (brain death), my soul and spirit will leave my body. I believe that the body I once occupied will no longer be me, should no longer be considered me and it will have become a corpse. I will no longer be there. Based on my faith in the promises of God and Jesus Christ, I desire, should it become apparent it is unlikely I (my body) will survive, that efforts shift from preserving me to preserving and facilitating the transplantation of all useful material of my body. I further with that my remains be made available to medical science and education as demeaned appropriate by my family and medical staff. I request my family make these wishes known as soon as possible to enable the best results for recipients. Gift of Life Donor Program representatives may be contacted by the medical facility as early as practical to ensure the best possible outcome for the recipients.

It is my wish that my friends and family shift from mourning me to celebrating those lives that will be saved and improved by our family's gift of life. I encourage them to establish a relationship with the recipients of they are willing. I encourage them to joyfully and fully cooperate with medical and donor procurement efforts.

I will no longer be where you are used to finding me, I am now everywhere. Love your husband, father, grandfather, brother, friend.

off, one group had to wear blind folds, but the other two groups weren't allowed to talk. They formed a line by placing their hands on each other's shoulders, and lead each other into the




adventure games area. That was their first challenge! Then each of the groups completed several elements in the adventure games, becoming more
