Convenient for some and an impediment for others.

The past two years have weighed on us in different ways, and it will certainly not be forgotten. The pandemic has added another layer of division to our world. These divisions have affected governments, schools, churches, and families. This pandemic has also made our society reevaluate what we consider as vital. We renamed jobs as essential and non-essential. All jobs are vital regardless of whatever occupation because it is how we support our family and community. We have had to adjust every aspect of our lives and factor in changes in which most of us weren't ready. One of those factors is our means of congregating with our fellow Brethren. That tap on your shoulder from your fellow brother or sister as an empathetic gesture goes a long way when we are in need. Streaming technology is not a replacement, it is used as a support to maintain and grow your congregation. It is a way to preach just like

hosted a virtual gathering on Tuesday evening November 9 for youth leaders who wanted to talk about and share ideas with one another as they make plans for next summer.





ANE District Board Update

The Atlantic Northeast District Board met virtually on Saturday, November 6, 2021. This meeting included all current Board members and staff, as well as incoming Board members, who were approved at District Conference. Among many items of discussion, action and reporting, a few highlights from the November 6 meeting are shared below.

- Board Chair Jeff Glisson recognized outgoing Board members with appreciation.
- The District Board Member Leadership Manual was adopted, which outlines the values and practices board members commit to as they do their work together.
- Belita Mitchell, chair of the Way Forward Shepherding Team, reported on the ongoing work of the Team. The Way Forward Shepherding Team meets monthly, looking at ways to help the Board engage with the District in the Way Forward mission and discussing ways to invite congregations to also engage with the Way Forward Mission.
- The Board affirmed the formation of a District Shalom Team and approved guidelines for the new team.
- The Board processed approvals for five ordination candidates, which represents the highest number of ordination candidates in one meeting in recent years. Each candidate came recommended by the District Ministry Commission.
- Incoming Board Chair Jim Grossnickle-Batterton led a time of consecration for the continuing and incoming Board members for their work and ministry on behalf of the Atlantic Northeast District.


Helping Hands Benevolence Fund to the Rescue!

The Oasis of Hope Fellowship (Iglesia Berith, Oasis De Esperanza) located in Lebanon, PA was recently able to make a difference in the life of a family in their church. This family found themselves in a difficult situation this summer. The roof of their home was damaged and water would come through the roof whenever there was rain. The ceiling inside the house was falling from the humidity. In addition, the entire family was suffering from asthma and other health issues so the strong smell of humidity in the home was danger for them. The family was at a

loss because they did not have the financial means to repair the roof.
They had reached out their homeowner's insurance company who declined to help them with this serious situation.

Pastor Arlyn Morales reached out to the ANE District to request help from the Helping Hands Benevolence Fund. She explained that the church was eager to help this family but that there were very limited funds available. The ANE District Witness and Outreach Commission approved a grant of \$5,000 to be used toward the needed repairs to this roof.

The work has now been completed and the family is doing well. They are happy and thankful with all the help that they received from the ANE District Helping Hands Benevolence Fund!
