### **Dedicated to Ministry**

A service of recognition was held on January 18 at Middle Creek CoB, for **Rev. Wilbur G. Rohrer** and his wife, Judy, who have retired from active ministry following 30 years of service to the congregation. Rev. Rohrer was called to the ministry by the congregation on August 29, 1984. He also served as moderator and then Ministry Team Leader for the congregation from 1997 – 2009.

Rev. J. Eric Brubaker gave the message titled "Honoring a Servant Leader." At the end of the service, Ministry Team Leader, John Hess, presented Wilbur and Judy with an engraved sculpture and a scrapbook of memories that had been put together by the members of the Middle Creek Church. A fellowship meal for invited guests followed the service. A drop-in was held in the afternoon for members of the congregation.

Wilbur retired as president and owner of Rohrer's Quarry after 51 years. In his retirement from active ministry, Wilbur will continue to serve on local Boards and for the Church of the Brethren on the denominational level and as a consultant to Rohrer's Quarry.



As members of the Witness and Outreach Commission interact with congregations in our district, we often hear stories of ways that our churches are reaching out to their communities. This month we are highlighting the summer Vacation Bible School program that took place last summer in Lewiston Maine:

### Vacation Bible School

If you had walked by 2 Shawmut Street in Lewiston, Maine, during our week of VBS this summer, you would have heard over 100 voices singing our theme song, Sail On!

We centered our week on the teachings of Jesus around the Sea of Galilee. The children hurried over the Gangway to Galilee each night to learn lessons from God's Word, to memorize Scripture, to build crafts, and to play games. Frank Reed taught the Adult Class about "Understanding Human Behavior." Thank you, Frank, for the time and effort you gave this ministry. Well done.

The offerings were given to the Voice of the Martyrs. We were able to collect money for 75 action packs (which included clothing, toys, bedding, etc.) for persecuted Christians around the world and 97 Bibles for "A Bible For Every Believer." Praise the Lord!


Each evening we gathered everyone together for a drama that emphasized the nightly take-home point. The children loved watching the lessons their jungle friends learned.

We were grateful that the Lord provided us with good weather and for safety throughout the week! I continue to stand amazed at how the Body of Christ pulls together for the week of VBS. So many different roles needed to be filled: under-standing the importance of this ministry, planting the seeds, and sharing Jesus with the children. The willingness of the Body of Christ is a true testimony of 1 Corinthians 12:12-31.

### Crisis in Nigeria

The Atlantic Northeast District sponsored two informational sessions on the crisis in Nigeria in January at Hempfield and Indian Creek congregations. Reverend Doctor Musa Mambula of Nigeria was a co-presenter at each event, sharing from his personal experiences in Nigeria.

A presentation on the US church's response to the crisis was a central focus of the meetings. Roy Winter of Brethren Disaster Ministries presented at Hempfield on January 4 and Mission and Ministry Board chair-elect Don Fitzkee delivered Winter's presentation at Indian Creek on January 11. Both events included a time of prayer and an offering for the Nigeria Crisis Fund. About 90 people attended the session at Hempfield and gave \$4,266. Some 50 people donated \$972 at Indian Creek.
