



Atlantic Northeast District Conference Wrap-Up



The forty-sixth Atlantic Northeast District Conference of the Church of the Brethren was held at Elizabethtown College, Leffler Chapel and Performance Center, on October 3. *Come to the Water* was the theme. Moderator was Robert Kettering, member of the Lititz congregation. Lebanon CoB and Lirio de los Valles Fellowship served as hosts for this year's conference. A total of 189 delegates attended, representing 71 out of 76 congregations.

Conference this year was one full day: Bible Study by Dennis Garrison, Gathering Music by Ridgeway Brass. Worship & Roll Call of Congregations and Fellowships, each were asked to bring an 8 ounce container of water from their home church, a baptistery, or stream or pond where their congregation baptizes. The water was emptied into a fountain. Followed by reports from District Board and related ministries.

A Minister's Recognition Luncheon, hosted by the District Ministry Commission, was held at the KAV, Brossman Center. Four fifty-year Ministers, Sam Cassel, White Oak: Glen Faus, Chiques: Robert Heffley, Hempfield; and Jim Myer, White Oak were recognized, as well as newly ordained, licensed, and placed ministers and ACTS Graduates.

Saturday afternoon service of worship and praise was attended by 273. Nuevo Amanecer praise team led by Aaron Gomez opened the service. Keynote speaker Thomas Zuercher presented an uplifting message on "Water Testing" John 7:37-38. Elizabethtown CoB Youth Ensemble performed the Offertory Song: "Something in the Water". An offering of \$ 2672 was also given to District Projects.

ANE Ministry Investment Plan Update 9/30/15

ANE staff celebrates and sincerely thanks all ANE members and congregations who have contributed volunteer time and finances this year. It is important to note:

- \$60,000 was provided as grant support for four urban congregations' outreach ministries ... because of your gifts;
- Resourcing Search Committees and coordinating the identifying and calling of candidates for 18 pastoral placements are taking place ... because of your gifts;
- Candidates are Interviewed for Licensing and Ordination to Ministry ... because of your gifts;
- Ministerial training and pastoral education is being made available ... because of your gifts;
- Interim Ministry is coordinated and creative church staffing explored ... because of your gifts;
- Ministry Partnering Agencies and Institutions are supported ... because of your gifts;
- Official records are kept, Pastoral Ministry Files are managed, accountability is deployed, back-ground checks are run, new persons are invited to consider Set-apart Ministry, Child Protection awareness is promoted, historical records are archived, communications are disseminated, events – big and small – are planned ... because of your gifts;
- We continue to resource Church plant projects and Fellowships in NY, ME, and PA. ... because of your aifts:
- Funds and leadership are provided for Church revitalization with Drexel Hill congregation ... because of your gifts;

As of 09/30/15 the fiscal investment in these ministries has been \$432,345.

As of 9/30 ANE's total giving was \$104,376 **short** of the year-to-date Ministry Investment Plan and \$62,612 **short** of expenses. Twenty-three percent (23%) of ANE congregations, fellowships, and projects have not yet contributed to our common district ministry. As members of the Witness and Outreach Commission interact with congregations in our district, we often hear stories of ways that our churches are reaching out to their communities. This outreach sometimes takes place in the form of an organized program. At other times, outreach is a result of seeing and meeting a community need.

Here is a story that was submitted by Peggy Rasmussen from Mechanic Grove:

Mechanic Grove CoB has served around 100 people the last Saturday in April for more than 6 years through the Flowing Oil Café. The Flowing Oil Café is the result of someone's dream to provide a dining out experience for those who cannot afford to eat out at restaurants. They are encouraged to give a donation, which helps with costs of the meals. With the support of Love INC of Lancaster, the dream is an enduring reality. Southern Lancaster County churches take turns serving the community with meals prepared by local congregations every other Saturday evening September through May. The meals take place in two centrally located churches in Quarryville, so there is good access.

When Mechanic Grove CoB members have served, they provided the food and devotions, prepared the meal, and then ate with the dinner guests. As part of the witness commission, I have had the joy of participating in this fellowship. Many of the dinner guests come regularly and enjoy the conversation with other regulars and getting to know new people. When I sit with them, we often talk about what brought them here and a little bit about themselves. They often bring up something that inspired them from the devotional. It has been a great outreach to the community, with the support and cooperation of the area church community.

John Rowe from Hanoverdale submitted this story:

Hanoverdale CoB has launched a new Drama/Musical Outreach Program called His Hypocrites. Behind the name... in the original Greek, *hypocrites* was their word for *actor*. But as I'm sure you're aware, by many inside and outside our church walls, Christians are viewed as "hypocritical" and often held to an unattainable standard of perfection. We know that only Jesus Christ lived a perfect life. Our name has been chosen to spark that inevitable conversation and in turn our response is always the perfection of Jesus Christ and it allows us to share Him and His grace/mercy in spite of our shortcomings.

We began last summer with "A Man Called Peter" about the life and ministry of Rev. Dr. Peter Marshall. We then added some dramatic roles to our annual Christmas Cantata/Musical. We just finished our second summer run... "Little Women" which played to 4 sold-out audiences and we added the element of a four-course dinner to this year's presentation. The "dinner theater" concept was well received and we will be continuing that format moving forward. We are currently in auditions for our 2015 Christmas program "Casting Call," which will present December 20 at a 10:00 AM combined service and have announced 2016's Summer Show... "Runaway" (The story of Onesimus from Philemon).

Our goal was to create a program that would "feel safe" for those who may not necessarily grace the doors of a church otherwise... We were extremely successful this past year, in that over 70% of our audience was from outside the regular attending body. At the end of each program, we have a tie-in and an opportunity for people to hear more about the gospel after the show. 
Come to the Well

Camp Swatara Travels to Acadia National Park


Why is the area around Bar Harbor and Acadia National Park called Downeast Maine? In 2016 you will have the opportunity to not only learn the meaning of "Downeast," but also experience firsthand the wonders and beauty of this area where the "waters meet the forests." From September 9-18 Camp Swatara is sponsoring a trip to Acadia National Park and the surrounding area. Ray and

Judy Powell, who have co-led this trip for the past nine years, have more than 30 years of experience exploring the Park. Activities will include nature discovery walks and boat rides, as well as a carriage ride through the Park. Park Ranger presentations will be included on several of these discoveries. Sightings of deer, eagles, seals and beaver are common. (Sorry, no moose, but you never know.) There will also time to visit the shops of Bar Harbor.

Housing accommodations while in Maine are in modern 2-3 bedroom cottages located on the water's edge outside of Bar Harbor (www.seasidemaine.com). Each cottage is comfortably furnished and includes private bedrooms (double occupancy), as well as a shared bath, kitchen, and living room. Travel to and from Acadia is done in two Camp vans and overnight accommodations while traveling are in hotels included in the cost of the trip. The estimated cost is \$975 per person (dependent upon final accommodation costs). This cost includes all housing accommodations, transportation, tickets, all breakfasts and the dinner/supper meals while in Maine. Similar trips with commercial vendors cost more than \$3,000. Space is limited to no more than 18 persons.

Past trips have included participants from various COB congregations such as Chiques, Palmyra, Myerstown, Lancaster, Phoenixville, Indian Valley, Spring Creek, Elizabethtown, Martic Grove and Mountville.


